Nationalism. On January 16, February 6

& 13, Pastor Dave will lead this Sunday School series. January is the month when we remember Anabaptist beginnings, 497 years ago. It's also the month we remember an alarming demonstration of Christian nationalism, when extremist stormed the US Capitol building one year ago. Christian nationalism is a framework of thinking which seeks to merge Christian and American identities. What does it mean to be followers of Jesus, who confess that Jesus is Lord, and live in the midst of this distortion? What is our response? Come learn and explore.

On January 27, the Thursday evening women's Bible study (via Zoom) will begin studying the book, HOW TO HAVE AN ENEMY: Righteous Anger and the Work of Peace by Melissa Florer-Bixler. If you didn't order a book, please do so on your own and contact Brenda Glanzer Lilliston if you plan to attend. "This book is an engagement with what real peace-making looks like. And the author starts not with making peace, but with being sure we're actually doing conflict well. This book is exceptionally timely as we see calls for unity without accountability or truth telling inside and outside the church. In her writing, Pastor Melissa Florer-Bixler examines our current situation and compares to what / how Jesus responded to foes in his day. She discusses historical truthtelling as the base and examining power structures as the important framework for naming harm. More importantly, she asks us to take the call of Jesus seriously - to stand with the marginalized and to be a true communal alternative to the ways of the Empire in which we live."

The Tuesday morning Women's Bible Study will resume on January 25, at 10 am on Zoom. We will be studying the Gospel of Mark, utilizing the book, Mark: Interpretation Bible Studies (IBS), by Richard I Deibert, as a resource. Cost of the book is \$13. If you are interested in attending, please contact Brenda Glanzer Lilliston. Please order the book on your own. "Mark challenges the reader to believe in the mystery of God--that even through difficult times, God reigns. Mark's Gospel carries the reader from the desert wilderness to Jerusalem, and from the crisis of the cross to the victory of the empty tomb."
