Some of us yearn for an additional way to make a difference beyond offering thoughts and prayers. We offer you the following possibility for an action step...a postcard campaign. It has been noted that hand written postcards to our representatives can made a difference. This is the **last Sunday** that there will be blank postcards available on the tables in the Fellowship Hall. Write a short message to your Kansas legislator(s) acknowledging the sadness, fear, and outrage you feel and ask them to pursue stricter gun control legislation. We will provide the addresses for our senators and representatives. Feel free to write more than one. You can leave them in the basket on the tables and we will mail them on Monday.

This fall, Pauline Sharp, chair of the Kanza Heritage Society and granddaughter of Lucy Tayiah Eads, first woman chief of the Kanza Tribe, will present her one person play in which she tells the story of the Kanza People through the eyes of her grandmother, Chief Lucy. The performance will take place in Wichita; a specific date and location is yet to be announced. To learn more about the Kanza Tribe, consider attending Washunga Days, this coming weekend (June 17-19) in Council Grove. Washunga Days is an annual festival which celebrates the culture, both past and present of Council Grove and Morris County. In association with the festival will be the Kaw Nation intertribal powwow and tours of Allegawaho Heritage Memorial Park outside of town where 168 acres of the Kanza Tribe's native homeland is owned by the tribe and reserved for recognition, education and respect for the culture of today's members of the Kaw Nation. Sharp has played an instrumental Pauline the role in establishment of Allegawaho Park.
