## God's Music: The Psalms New Worship Series beginning July 11

People love the Psalms. Many of us know lines from the Psalms by heart. Some people memorize whole psalms. And there are hundreds of songs based on words from the Psalms. They are integral to our devotional and worship life.

The Psalms sketch a *vast* <u>and</u> *unfiltered landscape* of the human condition: The agony and the ecstasy, the praise and lament that people experience ... and everything in-between—from joy at the harvest, to bitterness over a friend's betrayal; from wonder at the night sky, to the heavy burden of guilt; from the honey-sweet guidance of God's word, to the cursing of one's enemies. The Psalms compose a symphony with soaring heights and horrific depths ... and they have the *audacity* to call <u>all</u> <u>of</u> <u>it</u> *spiritual*.

The Psalms are brutally honest: People of faith get into trouble—with each other <u>and</u> with God—sometimes because they're victims, and sometimes from their own bad choices. The Psalms know <u>all</u> the profiles.


And yet, the Psalms proclaim that we are not alone in the heights or the depths of the human experience. God is the unavoidable <u>One</u> with whom we must deal. And, therefore, trouble is <u>never</u> the last word. The Psalms attest that just as God <u>created</u> us, so God <u>re-creates</u> us as <u>transformed</u> people.




