Call to Worship

Adapted from a camp presentation by Menno & Marianne Doerksen in the late 1960s.

In the beginning God created the Heaven and the earth and God said: Let us make man in our image, after our likeness, so God created man in His own image.

Was he white, or yellow, or black?

In the image of God created He him.

#### Was he Mennonite, Catholic, or Methodist?

It doesn't say – only that he created man. Man was created man, different from the fish and 4-footed animals, different in color – But still man, wanting the same things –

Food to eat, a place to sleep, land to work, to live on, to build a better world for our young

And he got that better world because man worked with man. To build a home. To build a church.

And it was man working with man who built Camp Mennoscah, the noisy cabins and quite campfire.

The clanging of the bell and the sounds of silence at night. And no one asked, was he black or white? Was he Mennonite, Catholic or Methodist? No one – but the sick in mind. We built a camp, powerful and glorious, because man worked with man.

And we built the camp so man could learn to live with man – in friendship and in peace. Because friendship belongs to all men; not to one color, not to one religion. No one asked at Camp Mennoscah is he black or white? Is he Mennonite, Catholic or Methodist?

We sang some songs.

We were hungry and we shared a meal.

And I thought to myself what a wonderful world this was with so many different people helping me to be healthy and happy, and how much I owed them. And I didn't think once that day of the songs we sang and the friends we made...

Is he black or white?

Is he Mennonite, Catholic or Methodist?

In all your deeds. In all your thoughts. In all you say, Remember this – "And God created man in His own image, In the image of God created He him" And it doesn't say he was white, and it doesn't say he was black, it doesn't say he was Mennonite, Catholic, or Methodist, it just says, "He created man" - and that's all of us.
