<u>New Worship Series</u> begins today. "The Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7): Jesus' Program for Living" will be our focus for Sundays in October and November. For Anabaptist Christians, this is the heart of Jesus' teaching and guidance on how to live as people of God's reign.

<u>Art for Sermon on the Mount Series:</u> The Sermon on the Mount is an important text among Mennonites. It is central to Mennonite theology. It is also extremely familiar to our ears. That's both good and bad. Because it is central to our understanding of following Jesus, it is important to have it well in mind. But, words, words that we know so well, sometimes are harder to really hear. This is where we found ourselves when wewere asked to create art for a fall series on the Sermon on the Mount.

How to do justice to a key text? How to do something visual with a text, the power of which is carried in the words themselves? How to visually format three chapters in a way that will be a threshold into hearing, seeing, in new and faithful ways?

The design of what you see this morning is based on the Mark carpet page from the Lindisfarne Gospels, an illuminated manuscript from the early 700s in the north of Britain. The words and phrases you see were chosen (after considerable study and prayer) to succinctly, and faithfully, convey Jesus' words of instruction and encouragement to live the reign of God. Our hope is that over the weeks of the series, different words or phrases will stand out, allowing you to hear, to consider, to see, to live more deeply into this text so core to our understanding of the reign of God. All proceeds will be donated to Camp Mennoscah and Family Promise.
