"The shepherds returned glorifying and praising God for all they had seen and heard" (Luke 2:20).

And yet, many of the things I look forward to the most this time of year are precisely the things that aren't new. Family meals, gift exchanges, sentimental decorations and ornaments with stories, the Moravian star at our front door, the seasonal songs and Scriptures of the church.

For the startled shepherds who received the angels' announcement of Good News, their lives went forward with a combination of the new and not-so new.

On the one hand, after they saw the infant Savior, the shepherds "returned." They went back to their routine, to their familiar animals and pastures and tasks and relationships and challenges. They went back to being shepherds. The first Christmas, like all the Christmases since, came to an end, and the shepherds went back to the not-so new.

On the other hand, they didn't just return. They returned "glorifying and praising God for all they had seen and heard." The newness of Christmas rippled through them and transformed their post-Christmas lives, so that they were never the same again. Christmas ended, but the Christmas joy remained. The joy filled the shepherds and spilled over and made all their normals new.

God's Christmas gift to us is that same rippling joy. joy we carry with us into 2022 and beyond. Our living Savior "returns" with us, and our normal will never be normal again!

The Craft Bazaar committee had fun considering options for our 2021 bazaar. Because of the yet unsettled situation with Covid cases, we decided it was in everyone's best interest to offer an alternative to our

usual bazaar format this year. Although this year turned out to be a lot of fun, we are SO looking forward to next year when we *believe*, *hope*, *pray*, *and plan* we will get to finally celebrate our 25<sup>th</sup>!

So, to try to keep everyone safe, we offered a couple of alternative opportunities this year. Like last year, Leona and Byron again made several batches of prerolled peppernut dough available for purchase. And like last year, these sold out! We also offered pre-ordered meals that consisted of a bowl of chicken noodle soup, a sausage sandwich, chips, and a piece of pie (cherry, dutch apple, or pecan). A total of 102 meals were "sold" by donation only – and the proceeds at this point total \$4,110 (include total of peppernut dough and meal donations). All proceeds will be split between Camp Mennoscah and Family Promise – unless gifts were designated for one or the other.

On a side-note...we heard from several people that some of the soup "smelled strange – but tasted fine". We tried to figure out the problem but couldn't find a consistent answer. We believe that the soup is safe to eat, but obviously if you have any concerns, please discard it. We are chalking that up to one of the strange mysteries of the universe – and hoping to do a chicken noodle soup re-do after the first of the year to ease this disappointment! J
