Go Public!

Now it happened in those days that Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan River (Mark 1:9).

In January we think about new beginnings. Indeed, some people commit to intentional New Year's resolutions.

The lectionary is an ancient Christian list of Scripture readings for Advent, Lent, and the entire year. This tradition assigns to a Sunday in early January texts about the baptism of Jesus.

Remembering Jesus' baptism early in the new year has rich meaning for us. Baptism marked a new beginning for Jesus: From that point on, Jesus turned from private life to *publicly* embrace and proclaim the reign of God.

Jesus' baptism and its placement by the lectionary tradition suggest a New Year's resolution for us: Can each of us resolve for 2022 to *go public* with our faith 20% more? What will that look like for you and me? What fears or faith-is-private dispositions do you need the Lord's help to overcome? What might happen if we put this New Year's resolution into practice?

As a pastor, people often ask me, "How can I grow in my faith?" One sure way is to increase our *going public* with it. It might involve more hands-on ministry with student groups on campus, or with refugees, with Family Promise, Working Men of Christ, or living into our commitment to welcome/inclusion in concrete ways. It might involve being intentional about hospitality with your neighbors. Or, something else. No matter how the Spirit leads you to *go public*, I guarantee you, you'll have lots of new things to pray about, and a much sharper lens through which to see the Scriptures!

God bless you this January as you re-embrace your baptism and *go public* a bit more as Jesus' follower.

Our New Mission Partner Family

Witness & Outreach is happy to introduce our new Mission Partner Family, Joseph &

Rachel Givens and their children, Elijah & Micaiah. They will serve with the Maria Skobtsova Housing Association in Calais, France. The Association offers temporary shelter to migrants from the Middle East and Africa, primarily, who are seeking refuge in route to England.

Maria Skobtsova House is a Catholic Worker house and community that, as stated on its website, "offers sanctuary and hospitality to vulnerable refugees," with an emphasis on providing shelter for women and women with children. At the house, residents and volunteers prepare and eat meals together, share daily tasks, practice English language lessons, and join together in recreational activities.

The house is situated in a city that has a complex history with people living in exile. For over 20 years, people have travelled from various countries to gather in and around the city of Calais, which is situated on the point in mainland Europe closest to the U.K.

Most of the Maria Skobtsova House residents living in exile hope to cross the English Channel into the U.K., either by raft or on vehicles that travel through the channel tunnel. Around the city, multiple formal and informal camps have been set up over the years, with law enforcement routinely tearing down campsites and abusing the people living in them, in efforts to make their living conditions so hostile that they will leave. The local city government has enacted bans on the distribution of food and water to exiled people organizations. Maria Skobtsova House can only welcome a limited number of individuals and families at any given time, and most guests only stay a week or two before moving on in their goal of reaching the U.K.

At the end of 2020, Maria Skobtsova House management board formally invited the family into an initial two-year volunteer term, through Mennonite Mission Network, with the possibility of a term extension. The Givens now plan to arrive in France in the spring of 2022. In the meantime, they are studying French, and working full-time jobs as well as coordinating fundraising and prayer support with the help of their Ministry Support Team (MST). An MST is a group of people that partner with a mission worker through encouragement, prayer, funding and fundraising support.

Their home congregation is Third Way Church in St. Paul, MN and they along with Hope and the following churches will help support the Givens Family...Neffsville Mennonite, Lancaster, PA; Swamp Mennonite, Quakertown, PA; First Mennonite, Mountain Lake, MN Grace Mennonite, Pandora, OH, Mountain View Mennonite, Kalispell, MT; Tabor Mennonite, Newton, KS; First Mennonite Church of New Bremen, Lowville, NY.

The Givens Family will be at Hope on Sunday, February 20. We look forward to meeting them and beginning our mission partnership together.
