Randy's Ramblings

I never did understand the fuss around Groundhog Day. I mean, I recognize the mystery of how an

animal seems to know the date on the calendar. It evokes a sense of awe. It's part of what draws people to places like the mission in San Juan Capistrano, California. (In case you don't know, that's where the swallows appear every year on March 19, which happens to be the date of St. Joseph's Day). And I've been there to watch the purple martins gather here in Wichita. (That happens in August each year.)

It really is awe-inspiring to note how nature seems to follow a calendar. The same thing can be said about the people who built places like Stone Henge. It was built with a sense of amazement about the mysterious world in which we live, a world that includes predictable events like the returning of swallows or the angle of the sun on the solstice.

But the idea of the groundhog's shadow predicting the weather is a little bit far-fetched for me. I mean, I know the date is exactly half-way between the winter solstice and the spring equinox. And it doesn't matter if we have six more weeks of winter or there are six more weeks until spring, it's really not saying much. (It is amazing that the groundhog knows we are halfway between the beginning of winter and the end of winter, though.)

I don't know if the fuss around Groundhog Day reflects a desire to avoid the science of the meteorologists; I suspect it's more a hankering for a sense of order that nature provides.

We all desire some sense of order in our lives, even those who enjoy variety and diversity.

Some people won't eat leftovers because they want something new every day. But even they prefer to eat at a certain time.

As we enter into a new phase of life at Hope Mennonite, I know there are some who want stability and order. We don't mind the change of seasons, for a new pastor to arrive, but we are anxious for the new season to begin. How long will the search process take? We are like those who watch the groundhog for a reliable roadmap for the future.

Unfortunately, God's ways are not our ways, as Isaiah points out (Is. 55:8). We can try to circumvent the process, but the pastoral search committee's work is better done slowly, methodically, and with great care. Doing so will allow us all to trust God's agency in their discernment work.

So, when Punxsutawney Phil makes his appearance this week, I'm going to give thanks that God prefers to keep the future a mystery and to watch for signs of God at work, no matter what the weather.

The process we will use for the review is called, "The Appreciative Way" and involves surveying various groups within the church in a group setting.

Group interviews will take place during the Sunday School hour in February/March. 
