#### **Randy's Ramblings**

Earlier this month we followed through on plans we made last summer – we donated Melissa's wheelchair to a non-

profit agency that helps fit and repair wheelchairs.

Our daughter, Melissa, used a wheelchair for long distance mobility ever since she was about 3 years old. She outgrew the stroller and was getting too heavy to carry, so we got a hot pink wheelchair. She was not able to control her wheelchair, we simply used it to move her from one place to another. She eventually learned to use her legs to walk, but never had any sense of balance or make a cognitive connection between her feet moving and where her eyes wanted to go, so the wheelchair was always used when we went more than a few hundred feet. In many ways, it became an extension of her body.

There were Halloween costumes that incorporated her chair. There was a star we attached to her chair for Christmas programs. There were large umbrellas that allowed both the person pushing and Melissa to stay dry in the rain. There was the bag hanging on the back of it to carry a change of clothing and whatever else she would need.

She outgrew that first chair, so we upgraded and changed color to purple. Then we had to change again. Eventually she had one where she lived that she used for most of her daily activities. We kept her old one for use at our home. That chair, her old one, was the one we used when we took her to church and to family events. After her death, we moved it to our basement.

We knew where we wanted to donate it. Earlier this month, we decided it was time, so we brought it upstairs and loaded it into the van.

I should have known what would happen to me as I did so, but I found myself sobbing uncontrollably. Pushing that chair brought back a physical connection with Melissa that has been missing for many months, now.

It is one of the potholes in the road of life that I could have foreseen, but hadn't fully prepared myself for. As I processed what happened to me, I realized I am not the only one living in grief, and that there are other events and things and dates on the calendar that stir up memories. Some bring smiles, some bring laughter, and some bring tears.

Those tears are in my mind as I read the Easter story this year. It helps me imagine the pain, the sorrow, the loss that the women felt as they approached the tomb. I don't know what they expected to find, but I can certainly imagine the sorrow they felt. I know how hard it is to see when there are tears in your eyes, for example. Those tears help explain some of their confusion when they see the stone rolled away from the tomb. It helps explain how Mary, who is so focused on what she is not seeing in the tomb, that she doesn't even recognize the voice of Jesus in the Garden. At least not until he calls her name.

I am more anxious to celebrate Easter this year than I have been in many years. Mostly, I am anxious to hear the story proclaimed so I can remember the promise that is mine – and yours – that not even death can separate us from the love of God.

There will be more tears, I am sure. And I am not afraid or ashamed of them. I am simply learning how to place them within the context of my love for Melissa and God's love for me. And that is what I will be celebrating on Easter Sunday!
