<u>Congregational Meeting on May 21</u> PCRC (Pastor Congregation Relations Committee) will hold a congregational meeting to process the congregational review and establish our next set of church priorities. We will meet during the Sunday School hour on May 21.

Five years ago, we established the following priorities.

- 1. Build a Welcoming Statement.
- 2. Be intentional and proactive about church growth.
- 3. Establish more small groups.
- 4. Explore ways to use the rental house for ministry.
- 5. Use of more music styles during worship.

Lee Schmucker will lead the session based on information gathered from the congregational review. All are invited - please bring your ideas on our future direction. Child care will be provided.
