Pastor/Congregation Relations Committee - Myron Regier, Bob Stolzle, Lee Schmucker New Justice Ministry Begins in Sedgwick County Hope Mennonite Church has joined a new interfaith justice ministry in Sedgwick County. A leadership group of Brenda Glanzer Lilliston, Marcus Loganbill, Lowell Birkey, Joanna Pinkerton, Vicki Howard, Randy Pinkerton, Jarod Regehr and Wendy Wiens have been trained along with over 150 other church members from 40+ faith communities. This is a ground-breaking initiative for our congregation to join forces with other congregations and faith groups in Sedgwick County to help advance justice in our community. The first step is to conduct listening sessions here at Hope. Each faith community will be dedicating time specifically to share personal stories surrounding the most pressing problems facing our community. A person from the leadership team will soon be in touch with you inviting you to participate in a listening session. This first step helps us because we cannot understand what impacts us all until we listen to one another. So, come, tell your story of "What keeps you up at night?" or "What anxieties keep you up at night worrying?" Together we'll tell powerful stories to help discover common threads and forge a grassroots network dedicated to fostering more justice in our community.

Hope Mennonite Fall Festival

Our second annual Hope Mennonite Fall Festival will be held on Saturday, November 4th from 9 a.m. – 2 p.m. at church. <u>And, as</u> <u>always, we need your help</u>! There will lots of ways to get involved – baking for the bake sale, helping bake peppernuts, browning meat/onions for bierocks, grilling sausage, working in the kitchen the day of, helping at the kids' booth, and of course, prayer for the event to bring honor to God and assistance to those in need beyond our walls. Here are key dates with basic information. PLEASE feel free to talk with any committee member if you have questions or need more information.

- Sunday, October 1 and October 8 pick up meat/onions and instructions to brown for bierocks. Also, we will take congregational pre-orders for bierocks. We will have a limited number available for first-come, first-served orders in our congregation (limit one dozen for pre-orders). We will not be advertising pre-orders outside of Hope. We will also have bierocks available for lunch on that day but don't plan to sell them in bulk the day of the sale at this time (pending how many get made!).
- Sunday, October 1, 8, 15, and 22 peppernut baking during Sunday School
- October 4 peppernut baking at church after Care and Nurture meal
- Sunday, October 15 deadline for returning meat to church AND deadline for pre-orders (call or email church office).
- Friday, October 20 bierock baking (<u>if you pre-ordered</u> bierocks they must be picked up at church between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. that day)
- Sunday, October 15 and 22 sign up to work on the 4th
- **Friday, November 3** Bring donated baked goods to church between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. (or bring them Saturday morning)
- Saturday, November 4 Bring your friends and families and come have breakfast and/or lunch and enjoy the day – and enjoy A Cuppa Hope coffee! J
- **Sunday, November 5** Celebration Lunch at church everyone is invited!
