Listening Gatherings concerning local justice issues are underway at Hope in partnership of 40+ faith communities banded together by the DART (Sedgwick County Multifaith Justice) organization. Hope everyone can attend your invited meeting time to share your story and hear more about this organization. The DART Organization network is comprised of 31 affiliated organizations in 10 states. Kansas has 4 other DART affiliates in Lawrence, Topeka, Kansas City and Johnson County. Southern Hills Mennonite is involved in the Topeka affiliate. This organization is rooted in diverse faith traditions, who find common ground in values of justice and fairness. Since 1982, DART has trained over 10,000 community leaders and 270 professional community organizers, who together have greatly impacted communities. Through the years, various affiliates worked on impactful solutions for their community concerning affordable housing, improving public transportation, job training, expanding health care, criminal justice and public education.

- Sunday October 8 pick up meat/onions and instructions to brown for bierocks. Also, we will take congregational preorders for bierocks. We will have a limited number available for first-come, first-served orders in our congregation (limit one dozen for pre-orders). We will not be advertising pre-orders outside of Hope. We will also have bierocks available for lunch on that day but don't plan to sell them in bulk the day of the sale at this time (pending how many get made!).
- Sunday, October 8, 15, and 22 peppernut baking during Sunday School
- Sunday, October 15 deadline for returning meat to church AND deadline for pre-orders (call or email church office).

- Friday, October 20 bierock baking (<u>if you pre-ordered bierocks they must be picked up at church between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. that day</u>)
- Sunday, October 15 and 22 sign up to work on the 4th
- Friday, November 3 Bring donated baked goods to church between 3 p.m. and 7 p.m. (or bring them Saturday morning)
- Saturday, November 4 Bring your friends and families and come have breakfast and/or lunch and enjoy the day – and enjoy A Cuppa Hope coffee! s
- **Sunday, November 5** Celebration Lunch at church everyone is invited!
