Like the first chalice and plate I shared, this one is quite dear to me. The first was dear because it represents the affirmation of this community. This one is far more ancestral in its dearness. I found it at Glendalough, a beautiful valley in the Wicklow mountains of Ireland and a site of spiritual transformation since the early 7th century. There is a woodland path just at the edge of the valley that leads a couple of miles into the tiny village where there is a working woolen mill. I took the path with the idea of getting a small woolen throw that would slip neatly into my one carry one suitcase. I returned along that path with this chalice and plate. That it survived the trip home intact is nothing short of miraculous. It speaks to me of that dear valley and of ancestors who once called Ireland home. Leslie James
