Randy's Ramblings

I did something I've never done before. Last fall I planted some bulbs in my yard. And then throughout the winter I waited, and I wondered.

I no longer remember how many I planted. I know some are crocus. Some are daffodils. Some are tulips. (No lilies because of my allergies.) I planted them around the three trees in our front yard. I remember miscounting how many I had when I began, so there are more around one tree than the others two.

But I've been wondering, did I plant them correctly? I mean, I have been known to say, "if you can't mow it, I don't want it in my yard." And the only times I've tried to plant things that survived were trees – and even a couple of those died. So, my track record hasn't been so good.

One day, I noticed that a squirrel had dug up one of the bulbs, making me wonder if any of them will survive. How many others suffered similar fates? Did I plant them too early? Too late?

I've been waiting and wondering for quite a while now – and my wait is almost over!

You can't imagine my surprise – and delight – when I saw something green starting to peek through the soil in early March. First one, then another. At last count, I could see 12 plants coming up. I don't remember which ones I planted where, but I'm recognizing some of the differences as they are growing.

It's giving me something to look forward to as Spring unfolds and Easter approaches.

I was telling someone about my anticipation of seeing how many flowers bloom when they told me the story of someone they had known. The person was a gardener, who planted bulbs in the fall, knowing their health was failing. The person died while the bulbs were still in the ground. In the spring, when those bulbs bloomed, the family recognized their loved one had been plotting resurrection.

Plotting resurrection. I like the sound of that. It's a marvelous way to think of what I was doing last fall! I was plotting resurrection, not just planting bulbs.

And as Easter approaches, I am looking forward to seeing what God does with my plot!

And I'm also wondering in what other ways we are plotting resurrection. How are we planting seeds in the lives and hearts of others as we share the good news of God's love? Where are we cultivating a new kind of world with our witness for peace? What does the plotting of justice look like?

The angel tells the women at the tomb to "Go, tell" the story (Mk. 16:7). God plotted resurrection, too. And we are the beneficiaries.
