You are invited to the 2024 Justice Together Nehemiah Assembly on Thursday, May 9th at 6 pm at Century II Convention Hall located at 225 W. Douglas. We are excited that our congregation will be joining 34 other faith communities and the broader community to show up with a vast number of individuals to stand up for justice. The goal is 2,000. We will seek commitments from local officials to act on our well-researched proposals on homelessness and mental health. We are thrilled that so many from Hope have committed to attend and it is not too late to join us for this historic event.

Free tickets for the Nehemiah Assembly are available in the fellowship hall after worship today or at the event. Carpooling from the church is available. We will meet at 5 pm. Please contact the church office if you would like to join the carpool either as a rider or driver. There is a lot of available parking, including free parking within walking distance of the venue.
