<u>Beginning this Sunday</u>, we will be joining Christians all over the world in marking the Season of Creation. The series "To Hope and Act with Creation" is a resource developed by the Climate Justice Ministry of Mennonite Church USA and created to support congregations as they seek justice and peace for all creation.

You may remember the image on the bulletin. It was originally created for a series on the Psalms in 2019 and represents the many Psalms celebrating the God of all creation. Its organizing element is the Golden Ratio, also known as the Divine Proportion because it so often appears throughout creation. It is emblematic of balance, harmony, reconciliation, mystery, and wonder as we ponder the ways of our God in creation. At the center is the Hebrew word, "You," the word used for God throughout the Psalms. On the outer borders are attributes of God. At the top, steadfast love. Clockwise around, righteousness, wonder, and faithfulness.

<u>Did Ya Know???....</u> that the meetings over the summer between Justice Together representatives and our elected officials on the Mental Health Proposals have been so successful that Justice Together is considering putting those proposals on a "monitoring status". This means meetings will still keep happening to hold officials accountable. So that does open space to add more Mental Health related proposals or choose another topic to develop other "justice seeking" proposals. Justice Together wants to hear what people say in the Fall Listening Sessions to determine the next steps.

The progress on the Mental Health Proposals include:

- when an ICT team (Integrated Care Team including a mental health professional, police officer and EMS member) answers an emergency call, issues are resolved 65% of the time. Before Justice Together, there were 2.5 ICT teams in Sedgwick County and did not operate on weekends; now they are 6 ICT teams and are answering calls 24/7.
- the \$200K offered to SACK (Substance Abuse Center of Kansas) has helped train and hire case managers who help individuals navigate the transportation system and make their appointments.
- continue to work with ComCare to provide Psychiatric Care during weekend times plus the current Monday through Friday times.

- Karen Zehr gave an update on her Executive Board meetings with MC USA. The next convention in 2025 will be held in Greensboro, North Carolina.
- * Kendal Warkentine gave an update on the Western District Conference Assembly and thanked Hope for financially supporting church delegates. Three churches were welcomed to WDC; one church was released and one church was closed. There are 3 new church plants including one in Guatemala. The budget and new fiscal year, October-September (beginning in 2025) were approved as well as the slate of leaders.
