<u>These next weeks</u>, we will be joining Christians all over the world in marking the Season of Creation. The series "To Hope and Act with Creation" is a resource developed by the Climate Justice Ministry of Mennonite Church USA and created to support congregations as they seek justice and peace for all creation. During the series, our call to enter into worship will be our chimes along with bird songs.

You may remember the image on the bulletin. It was originally created for a series on the Psalms in 2019 and represents the many Psalms celebrating the God of all creation. Its organizing element is the Golden Ratio, also known as the Divine Proportion because it so often appears throughout creation. It is emblematic of balance, harmony, reconciliation, mystery, and wonder as we ponder the ways of our God in creation. At the center is the Hebrew word, "You," the word used for God throughout the Psalms. On the outer borders are attributes of God. At the top, steadfast love. Clockwise around, righteousness, wonder, and faithfulness.

<u>Did Ya Know</u>.... At the Justice Together's May Nehemiah Assembly, one of the commitments made by city and county leaders was to work together, along with the Kansas Department of Aging and Disabilities Services, to come up with a braided funding approach to fill the gap in the annual operating budget of the proposed **Multi-Agency Center (MAC)** a one-stop location for people experiencing homelessness to access emergency shelter, affordable housing, and support services all in one place.

Justice Together's Homelessness Research Committee knew that there would be a gap in the funding of the proposed Multi-Agency Center (MAC). That is why They secured commitments at the Nehemiah Assembly from Mayor Wu, City Manager Layton, County Commissioner Chair Baty, and County Manager Stolz to work together on a braided funding approach to ensure that the operations at the MAC would be fully funded.

In recent follow up meetings with the aforementioned officials, Justice Together learned that the gap in the MAC budget is much greater than they were told: It is estimated that the gap in the MAC budget is between \$3 million - \$4 million. They also learned that, even as the projected budget gap grows, the City of Wichita has no plan to increase its annual contribution beyond

\$500,000 and Sedgwick County will not be designating a financial offering to support the budget of the MAC.

On a positive note, according to an August 26 Wichita Eagle article, plans by the Wichita Homelessness Task Force include development at the former Park Elementary School to be used as an emergency winter shelter that will be ready by Thanksgiving 2024.

Justice Together continues to meet with city and county officials monthly to make sure that they follow through on their promise to fully fund the MAC, which would also be located at the old Park Elementary School. Justice is often a slow process but we have hope because now Hope Mennonite is a part of a larger organization that will hold our leaders accountable to help "the least of these" in our community.

The 2024 CROP Walk will be held on **October 6**, Sedgwick County Park. You are invited to participate by walking and/or making a donation toward the goal of "ending hunger one step at a time." An email was sent out with registration information. There will be a lunch at the park prior to the walk. Please sign up if you plan to attend.
