<u>Did Ya Know</u>...Hope's Listening Sessions for Justice Together will be held during Sunday School time on Sept. 22. Now, you might be thinking, "been there, done that, no reason to attend this year." However, Listening Sessions are a key foundation on which Justice Together is built. JT believes that together we can tackle the serious problems that affect Wichita and Sedgwick County. It starts with sharing stories about what is going on in our lives.

Last year, after compiling the many concerns mentioned during Listening Committees across Sedgwick County, Justice Together Network members voted for Homelessness and Mental Health as our top two priorities to focus on.

You might be thinking homelessness and mental issues should keep JT busy for at least five years. And you are right, homelessness will continue as a priority in 2025 because the commitments made by our officials at May's Nehemiah Assembly have yet to be fulfilled.

With the progress made on the Mental Health initiatives, the Justice Together Board has voted to monitor those priorities. Our priority of having fully staffed 24-7-365 mobile crisis coverage for Sedgwick County has made a huge impact because 69% of the time, the crisis unit can stabilize the person in crisis without that person needing to be taken anywhere. Our other mental health priority of providing 300 people in need with caseworkers, peer support and transportation plan for outpatient care has also been successful. This leaves potential for choosing a new priority or continuing to work on other Mental Health related issues. That is why telling our stories matters this fall. "We cannot understand what impacts us all until we listen to one another." Come, tell your story."

We hope you will join a listening session on September 22 during the Sunday School hour. A couple of Zoom sessions might be offered at a later time.
