A Good Word

Last month, I shared about the AMBS class I took on congregations in transition and the recommended areas of focus for the congregation

during a pastoral transition time:

- 1. **Heritage**: review how the congregation was formed and shaped
- 2. Mission: clarify identity & discern vision
- 3. **Leadership**: watch for new leaders/review organizational structure (note a correction to the order of the tasks)
- 4. **Connections**: relationships beyond congregation
- 5. **Future**: apply what is learned in developing congregational profile for search

In November, I reflected on what kinds of work I see the congregation doing and having done on the first two topics, so in December, I'll reflect on the work of leadership I see happening.

Leadership:

Hope has a long and strong history of lay and pastoral leadership! Some of you have been leaders in the church in various ways since its inception, and some of you are new leaders in the church. I feel deep gratitude for the many past and present ministries led by gifted members and attenders of this church!

I've been impressed with how well the church's commissions and committees work together: making decisions, being transparent about how those decisions are made, and holding those decisions lightly as they turn the work over to the church to carry out. I'll share an example of a committee whose way of working I've only observed second-hand, but seems to exemplify this way of working together:

The Music Committee meets every few months to choose hymns for the upcoming worship services. They receive information about themes and scripture from the secretaries, they meet and choose hymns, and then they send their selections right back to the office to share with musicians and staff.

How great is that, right? But it gets even better! If the preacher or musicians decide to switch things around, the music committee doesn't mind at all! Can you believe it? I'm not exaggerating here about the wonder of this openness. In some churches and in some circles, decision-makers guard their authority without flexibility or humility, and this costs everyone. The music committee has the authority to do their task, and then they let go of what happens with it next!

It's possible this doesn't always work as smoothly as I've observed so far, or that the decision-making process within the committee is neither respectful nor enjoyable. But I suspect members of the committee wouldn't stick around on the committee if it weren't going well for them!

If you feel your committee or commission has room for improvement, I hope you'll speak up to your coworkers in Christ to seek a way forward that allows for all voices to be heard, decisions to be clear and flexible, and for members to feel respect and joy as they participate—and then see how the Spirit moves!

I can tell the congregation has worked diligently and thoughtfully in the past to create an organizational structure that empowers and supports leaders. Having so much pastoral transition over the past 2 ½ years—you've had six pastors in that amount of time (Dave, Susan, Melissa, Randy, Heidi and me)--has tested your energy and your "usual" ways of doing things.

During the month of December, I will be praying for each commission and committee throughout the month. I've already been regularly praying for the search committee, but will mark the meetings of each group in December (or pick a day during that month if you're not meeting) and pray for that group in advance of their meeting. I invite each of you to join me in praying for a committee or commission during the month of December and letting that group know about your prayers!

In case you don't always let the office know when your committee or commission is meeting, please make sure to do so this month so I know when to pray for you. May God continue to bless and empower this church to bear the fruits of the Spirit in its work together!

TO YOUR HEALTH

Microplastics Plastic production has skyrocketed from just 1 million pounds per

year in 1950 to a staggering 400 million tons in 2023. Even more alarmingly, projections suggest this could reach 1.2 billion tons annually by 2060.

Growing evidence suggests microplastics are a significant public health concern. Microplastics have been found in human lungs, blood, and even in the placenta. Microplastics can interfere with digestive and respiratory systems, and the chemical additives they release can disrupt the endocrine and reproductive systems. One source estimate we may consume up to the size of a credit card in microplastics PER WEEK!

Microplastics are tough to avoid, because of all the ways we rely on plastic in our daily routines and the many potential sources of microplastics.

Major sources are plastic water bottles (and definitely keep them out of the heat), plastic cutting boards, heating food in plastic, plastic utensils, thermal printed receipts. Even some brands of dental floss, bandaids, parchment paper, clothing, and tire dust in the air are sources. Store your foods in glass when possible, avoiding plastic bags and containers and use filtered water.

Reflections:

I hit a wall right at the two months mark, realizing I was working six-day work weeks for a three-quarter time job. Praise God! So now I take Fridays off when I'm preaching rather than trying to finish on Friday and failing every week. I consider the fact that it only took me two months to make this change quite a success!

Next Monday is the 17th anniversary of my ordination to Christian ministry, which is a wonder to me. I'm grateful for the wide and wonderful variety of ministries I've been involved with over these past nineteen years (two years licensed and 17 since ordination): junior and senior high youth ministry, preaching, event prayers, wedding preparation and officiation, funerals, community organizing, pastoral care, racial justice work, mentoring new pastors, thrift shop management, public health advocacy, leading retreats, administrative work, and probably a dozen other things I'm not thinking of now. What a blessing!

Hope has many gifted ministers in its midst, a few of whom have seminary training and most of whom don't. What a blessing! How will the church continue to call and nurture those gifts? Who else will the church call into ministry? How might Hope support someone's interest in attending seminary? What kind of pastor will help you to thrive and grow (not necessarily in size) over the next five or ten years? How will you help your next pastor to thrive and grow (not necessarily in size) over the next five or ten years?

These are questions that the Holy Spirit can guide you in answering (and many other questions I haven't asked, too!). I hope my presence here can help prepare you for what's next, trusting the wisdom of Christ, the movement of the Holy Spirit and the love of our Mother/Father God.

Justice Together

Justice Together has been busy TOGETHEI launching the 2024-2025 justice

ministry cycle with listening sessions and choosing priorities to study and research.

Affordable housing is the new priority Justice Together plans to address at the 2025 Nehemiah Assembly on May 8th at the Eugene M. Hughes Metroplex. Homelessness will remain a priority in the 2024-2025 Justice Ministry Cycle as officials have yet to deliver on their commitment to fully fund the operating budget for the Multi Agency Center and to implement a low barrier, I-9 eligible photo ID program.

This fall 70 listening sessions occurred that engaged more than 514 people to tell their stories. Over 350 people (17 from Hope) came out to launch the 2024-2025 justice ministry cycle at the Community Problems Assembly on November 7, plus more than 570 people (including 30 people from Hope) have already said "yes" to be justice ministry network members.
