"A Good Word"

Since November, I've been sharing reflections about Hope from the AMBS class I took on congregations in transition. The instructors recommended five focus areas for congregations during a **pastoral transition (time between settled pastors)**

- 1. **Heritage**: review how the congregation was formed and shaped
- 2. Mission: clarify identity & discern vision
- 3. Leadership: watch for new leaders/review organizational structure (note a correction to the order of the tasks)
- 4. **Connections**: relationships beyond congregation
- 5. **Future**: apply what is learned in developing congregational profile for search

In November, I reflected on what kinds of work I see the congregation doing and having done on **heritage** and **mission**. In December, I reflected on the work of **leadership** I've seen and in January I reflected on Hope's **connections**.

It's providential to be looking at Hope's **future** in the month when you'll be hosting a candidate for the settled pastor position! Your work to develop a congregational profile and to identify priorities for a new settled pastor is bearing fruit after more than a year of waiting. Thanks be to God!.

The first weeks of February will be filled with anticipation: first of Ruth's visit, then of the congregational vote on whether to invite her to join the church as your pastor, and then, if the vote affirms that invitation, to confirm her acceptance of your invitation. I won't be part of that weekend's events, but I'll be holding you all in prayer as you meet Ruth, worship together, ask questions, and share your own stories with her.

Hope's leadership is already actively preparing for the arrival of a new settled pastor. Vision Council is preparing a more detailed job description for the pastor's position, clarifying relationships of accountability and support, and getting a few other administrative questions cleared up. Deacons are getting themselves ready, too, by updating their list of responsibilities. They plan to share that with Vision Council for approval, and then with the congregation. This will be a big help to new deacons as well as to a new pastor.

I trust that all parts of the church are using what you have learned over the past 2.5 years—and well before that—to prepare for a new pastor. And I trust that we're all listening for the Spirit's movement to map a way forward. Hallelujah!

Prone to Wander: A Lenten Journey with Women in the Wilderness by Joanna Harader. God meets us in the wilderness.

Though most of us have never wandered a literal desert for forty years, we have all spent some time wandering in a wilderness of one kind or another. So, too, have many women across the pages of the Bible. In their stories of doubt and questioning, of dryness and distance, we can find guideposts for the inevitable wilderness periods in our own lives. As we enter into the wilderness season of the church year, this Lenten devotional by Joanna Harader explores the stories of thirty biblical women--from Eve to Mary Magdalene--who had their own such experiences. For some, the women inhabited a literal wilderness. For others, their wilderness was metaphorical. All were drawn closer to God, who does not leave us to wander alone. As you consider these women who inhabited a swath of wilderness spaces, draw closer to the God who met them--and meets you--there.
