<u>Progress is happening</u> for marginalized people in Wichita because the **City of Wichita ID Card is** now a reality! Justice Together teamed up with the Homelessness Task Force and the city of Wichita to encourage this low barrier ID card. The Wichita City Council unanimously approved it on March 22. Many homeless people lose their regular form identification because of their situation. This card helps people when seeking employment, shelter and benefits. See Wednesday's Wichita Eagle for more information. <u>If you want to find out more</u> about Wichita's homelessness situation through the eyes of people who have lived it, service providers and local officials then come to see **the film Hope in the Heartland: Wichita's Quest to End Homelessness.** It will be shown on Thursday, March 27 at 6:00-8:45 pm in the sanctuary of Chapel Hill United Methodist Church, 550 North Chapel Hill. There will be a post screening discussion of the current situation. This showing is sponsored by Justice Together.
