"A Good Word"

"Take a Child to Work Day" is celebrated on April 24 this year, the fourth Thursday of the month. Will any of you be taking a child to work with you that day? I'd love to hear about it from anyone who does!

The day began in 1993 as "Take Our Daughters to Work Day" to "provide a way to make girls visible, valued, and heard in the workforce." In 2003, the event was expanded to include boys, though boys actually were included long before then. The current purpose of the annual event is to "empower young people to take bold steps toward their dreams, fostering the confidence and resilience they need to succeed."

When my daughter was younger, I often took her to work with me, occasionally preparing a sermon in the sanctuary while she played with our dog among the pews. (We were hoping for St. Francis's blessing with a pet in the sanctuary?) I suspect my daughter still didn't really know what I did as a pastor, and I suspect that many of you might also wonder what in the world a pastor does for 30 or 40 hours a week!

My memo of understanding spells out categories of activity for my work week, but much of my work week *looks* like sitting (or standing) still: in front of a computer, in front of a Bible or commentary, in a meeting with coworkers or congregants or other pastors, or in prayernot very exciting to watch! And not very good for one's health, if not broken up with a walk or a meal or a friendly visit.

The primary movement in ministry—which is hard to see with one's eyes or measure at the end of a week—is of the Spirit. That doesn't let pastors off the hook for doing good work, but it puts the power and the credit where it belongs: with God.

Meanwhile, if I were to take a child to work with me today, I'm afraid it wouldn't readily "empower them to take bold steps toward their dreams." It would more likely bore them to tears and leave them asking to play outside or to enjoy a snack!

I pray, though, that Hope's children (and adults) feel empowered by the Holy Spirit in their time at Hope through worship, fellowship and faith formation—and with that confidence can explore their talents and find their path to contribute to God's reign on earth. Maybe even as a pastor.

Witness and Outreach Commission

<u>Did you know?</u> Government assistance does not cover basic hygiene items such as soap, toilet paper, toothpaste, shampoo, feminine hygiene, or laundry detergent.

Simply Hygiene is a local 501(c)3 organization that

distributes hygiene products to over 200 schools and 87 organizations in the local area. Family Promise is one of the organizations that benefits from these distributions.

"Our mission at Simply Hygiene is to empower people with essential hygiene products that promote health and hope." These products are distributed in a way that protects the dignity of the recipients.

Ways to support this organization include donating products from a list provided, donating money (they actually can buy cheaper in bulk), hosting a Hygiene Drive to collect hygiene items, and volunteering with Simply Hygiene.

One of the small groups at Hope has volunteered at their warehouse several times and found this to be a very rewarding experience.

Justice Together Gets Things Done

Due to the great turnout of over 1,400 people at the May 2024 Justice Together's Nehemiah Assembly, and team work with the Homeless Task Force, ComCare, the Substance Abuse Center of Kansas our local and state officials were encouraged (and prodded) to make some good things happen in a short time:

- Most recently, the Wichita City Council approved and is in the process of implementing the City of Wichita ID Card! This low barrier ID will help many marginalized people when seeing employment, shelter and benefits.
- There are now six fully functioning Integrated
 Care Teams (a mental health professions, EMS
 member and police officer) to answer crisis
 emergency calls. They can now
 operate 24/7 instead of just weekdays.
- Substance Abuse Center of Kansas can hire and train case managers to mentally ill and other individuals make appointments and navigate the

transportation system to keep up with their physical and mental health issues.

• ComCare's Psychiatric Care is now available 24/7 instead of just weekdays.

Justice Together continues working towards a fully funded and sustainable Multi Agency Center to provide both shelter and accessibility to agencies that provide assistance for people in need. Justice Together is also researching and coming up with possible ways to deal with the Affordable Housing issue.
