Sanctuary Remodel Update: We have received quotes for the remodel construction of the sanctuary for video monitors. The cost is approximately \$25,000. On July 13<sup>th</sup> Vision Council will host a discussion on whether or not we want to move forward with the construction or consider an alternate installation plan. As a refresher, the congregation has previously voted in favor of building in the monitors rather than mounting them on the existing front walls. However, the caveat included was that preference would be dependent on the cost. Please give this spending prayerful consideration and plan to join us for the discussion and decision on July 13<sup>th</sup> following worship.
