

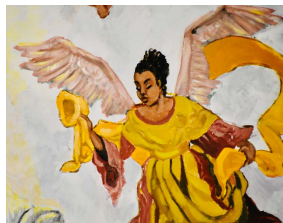
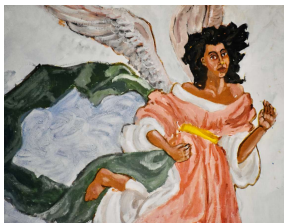

A variety of delicious (!) soups will be provided, along with crackers and bread. Our annual congregational meeting will be held next Sunday, **January 25**, during the Sunday School hour. The annual meeting book was emailed Thursday. There are paper copies on the table by the mailboxes. This meeting is for all members and regular attendees.

Please note these proposed congregational bylaws amendments.

[No change]: Individuals who regularly attend church services but are not members may participate in Congregational Meetings. Such nonmembers must designate on all ballot votes that they are nonmembers.

[Deleted]: If more than 20% of the total votes are cast by nonmembers, the votes of nonmembers will not be counted or considered.

[New]: If 20% of total votes are reached by nonmembers, the nonmember votes are weighted at 20% maximum value of the total vote.

[No change]: For non-ballot votes, any person attending the meeting shall have the right to request that the votes of nonmembers and members be counted separately, with the above-described 20% limitation to be applied. Vision Council may make provisions for absentee ballots and ballots for non-member youth.

All women at Hope Mennonite are invited to the Thursday evening Bible Study. The study begins on Thursday, January 29 at 7 p.m. and is on zoom only. The study will be completed on April 26. The book we will be studying is called Making It Plain: Why we NEED Anabaptism and the Black Church by Dr. Drew Hart. "In the Witness of Black and Anabaptist Christian communities across time, we find a faith that takes the life and teachings of Jesus seriously. Weaving together narrative history, theology, and practical guidance, Dr. Hart compels readers to engage the best of these faith streams to forge an "Anablacktivist" faith where everyone belongs, where everyone can thrive, and where everyone matters, especially the last and the least." Camp Mennoscah is asking their partner churches to participate in a matching funds challenge to finish the remodeling of the retreat center.
